Did you know that some of us inherited as much as 4% of our DNA from Neanderthals? That's just one of the many astonishing discoveries you'll make when you visit our newest major exhibition, **Neanderthal**. Opening weekend is especially exciting, with a lively trivia game and a table where you can handle stone tools. This is also your chance to enjoy a lecture by Neanderthal experts Marylène Patou-Mathis and Pascal Depaepe, and to take a tour of the exhibition with curator Janet Young (in English), or Marylène Patou-Mathis (in French). **Neanderthal** will be here all summer, but there's only one opening weekend!

As part of the new special exhibition, **Neanderthal**, volunteers at two interactive stations will help visitors challenge outdated myths about our ancient cousins. First, get handson with stone tools as you learn more about the daily lives of Neanderthals, as well as the work of Canadian geologists and paleontologists, Henri-Marc Ami. Then, test your Neanderthal knowledge in a volunteer-led trivia game, and learn more about the genetic relationship between Neanderthals and *Homo sapiens*.
